#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

In response to a similar proposal from the current session (HB 235, LR # 0855-01), officials from the **Office of Administration** – **Administrative Hearing Commission, Missouri House of Representatives,** and the **Missouri Senate** assumed the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agencies.

Officials from the **Office of Administration – Division of Budget and Planning** assume the proposal should not result in additional costs or savings to their division. There is a potential general revenue impact due to cessation of biennial reversion of lapse to general revenue.

**Oversight** assumes Office of State Courts Administrator would have expended any balance in the Statewide Court Automation Fund prior to the September 1, 2009 unexpended balance transfer to the general revenue fund. Therefore, Oversight assumes no fiscal impact to the general revenue fund.

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** assume the proposed legislation would have no fiscal impact on the courts.

**Oversight** assumes the proposed legislation would remove the September 1, 2009, expiration date of the Statewide Court Automation Fund and the statewide court automation fund fees. The balances in the fund for fiscal years 2006, 2007, and 2008 are as follows:

### ASSUMPTION (continued)

Oversight assumes the proposal would result in continued revenues and costs to the Statewide Court Automation Fund in fiscal years 2010, 2011, and 2012. Based on the data from the past three fiscal years, Oversight assumes the proposal would result in average revenues of approximately \$5,300,000, costs of approximately \$4,100,000, and transfers of approximately (\$1,100,000), resulting in a net increase to the Statewide Court Automation Fund of approximately \$100,000 per fiscal year. FY 2010 amounts have been adjusted to reflect 10 months.

### FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

### FISCAL DESCRIPTION

The proposed legislation removes the expiration date for the Statewide Court Automation Fund and allows the fee to be collected and the fund to function indefinitely without a transfer of any unexpended balance to the General Revenue Fund.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
