FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of Prosecution Services, Missouri Senate, Boone County Sheriff's Department, Springfield Police Department, City of Centralia, and Cass County** assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agencies.

Officials from the **Office of the Attorney General (AGO)** assume any potential costs arising from the proposal can be absorbed within existing resources.

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** assume the proposed legislation would have no fiscal impact on the courts.

Officials from the **Columbia Police Department (CPD)** assume the fiscal impact to the CPD and the City of Columbia would include the cost of initial inspection for verifying property maintenance standards/compliance (i.e. building code issues) and ongoing compliance checks related to the criminal side of the statute.

Oversight assumes the Columbia Police Department and the City of Columbia could absorb any costs associated with the proposed legislation within existing resources.

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety – Missouri State Highway Patrol** and the **Missouri House of Representatives** did not respond to Oversight's request for fiscal impact. However, in response to a similar proposal from the current session (HB 321, LR # 0840-02), officials assumed no fiscal impact.

Officials from the Greene County Sheriff's Department, Jackson County Sheriff's Department, St. Louis County Police Department, Kansas City Police Department, St. Louis Metropolitan Police Department, various Missouri cities, and various Missouri counties did not respond to Oversight's request for fiscal impact.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.

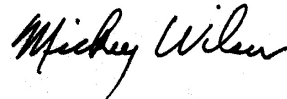
