FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Office of the Secretary of State** and the **St. Louis County Board of Election Commission** assume that there is no fiscal impact from this proposal.

Officials at the **Platte County Board of Election Commission** assume the anticipated costs for printing 60,000 voter identification cards, in 2010 and in 2012 is between \$1,200 to \$1,500.

Officials at the **Kansas City Board of Election Commission** assume additional printing and postage fees to run between \$5,000 and \$15,000.

Officials at the **Cass County** assume that if the County were to send a card to nearly every registered voter who had not received one in the last six months, that the cost would be \$25,000 to Unknown.

Officials at the **Clinton County** assume additional costs for paper work and postage.

Oversight assumes that since election authorities are currently required to send to each voter a notification card and this proposal changes the notification card to an identification card that there is no additional cost to the election authority for this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION



Currently, election authorities are required to issue voter notification cards to voters no later than 90 days prior to a primary or general election with certain exceptions. This bill changes the reference from notification to identification cards and specifies that individuals registering to vote by postcard and who have not voted will not receive an identification card.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
