FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services, Missouri Department of Conservation, Missouri Department of Transportation, and Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

Officials from the **Department of Mental Health (DMH)** state the proposal would not place any obligation or requirement on the DMH that would create a fiscal impact.

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety (DPS) - Directors' Office** state they are unable to determine the fiscal impact of the proposal and defer to the Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan for response regarding the potential fiscal impact.

Officials from the **DPS - Missouri State Highway Patrol (MHP)** defer to the Missouri Department of Transportation for response regarding the potential fiscal impact of this proposal on their organization.

Officials from the **Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration** state having reviewed the proposed legislation and having sought the conclusion of the appropriate board(s), they are of the opinion that this proposal, in its present form, has no fiscal impact on their organization.

Officials from the **Department of Social Services (DOS)** state the bill modifies the definition of "clinical social work" by adding community organization, planning, and evaluation to the list of activities that a clinical social worker engages in. The bill also prohibits government entities, public or private agencies, and organizations in the state from using the commonly used abbreviations for social worker designations to refer to volunteer or employment positions unless the volunteers or employees in those positions meet the criteria set forth in the licensing law.

The bill does not make any change to Section 337.603(2), which states that the social worker licensing requirements do not apply to, "The practice of any social worker who is employed by any agency or department of the state of Missouri while discharging the person's duties in that capacity." Since state employees remain exempt from licensing laws, no fiscal impact is anticipated.

Section 376.811 of the proposal states every insurance company, health services corporation, and health maintenance organization doing business in Missouri is required to offer in all health insurance policies, benefits or coverages for recognized mental illness, excluding chemical

dependency. Such coverage must include at least two sessions per year with a psychiatrist, psychologist, licensed professional counselor or licensed clinical social worker. This proposal extends this requirement to include licensed marital and family therapists. This provision will have no fiscal impact on the DOS because the required number of visits is unchanged; it just adds another type of provider as an option.

The proposal may positively impact small business marital and family counselors.


FISCAL DESCRIPTION
