Bill Summary: This proposal establishes the Line of Duty Compensation Act which authorizes a claim to be filed with the Division of Workers' Compensation on behalf of public safety workers who are killed in the line of duty.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, Department of Corrections, Department of Public Safety' Director's Office, Fire Safety, Capitol Police, Creve Coeur Fire District, Missouri Department of Conservation, Office of the State Treasurer, Department of Health and Senior Services** and the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** assume that there is no fiscal impact from this proposal.

In previous sessions officials at the **Department of Labor and Industrial Relations** did a search of the Division's computer system which showed that over the four year period 2003 to 2006 there was an average of 15 deaths of the occupations Emergency Medical Technician, Firefighter, Law enforcement officer, Paramedic, Volunteer firefighter and correctional officer. The Division was unable to determine through its injury and fatality coding system whether any deaths for the occupations supervisors, wardens, superintendents, youth supervisors, parole agents, school teachers and correctional counselors occurred in the line of duty as defined in the bill. This number also does not include any deaths where the occupation may have been coded in error when reported to the Division, but that may be eligible for the benefit provided for in the bill.

Oversight assumes that during the four year period reviewed 15 people could have filed a claim under this proposal. Oversight assumes that the actual number of people killed during that time was likely greater. The benefits would be paid for deaths after August 28, 2009. Oversight has shown in this fiscal note that the amount paid out yearly from the General Revenue Fund would be "unknown greater than \$150,000."

Oversight assumes the benefits of \$10,000 will be effective August 28, 2009, and therefore will assume 13 deaths (15 x 10/12) in FY 2010.

Officials at the **Missouri Highway Patrol** assume the first trooper who died in the line of duty was in 1933. To date, there have been 28 total, 9 of those occurring since 1999. Something like this is impossible to predict, but if the Patrol were to take the average of the past 9 years, there has been approximately one trooper per year who died in the line of duty. Based solely on that average, the cost of this legislation would have been approximately \$10,000 per year, presumably from General Revenue funds. For purposes of this fiscal note, that would be our estimate for future years as well.

Officials at the **Department of Natural Resources** assume they have 48 full-time rangers and 2

commissioned facility managers who could be affected by this proposal. The fiscal impact would be unknown, as this would depend on the number of law enforcement killed in the line of duty. The Division's maximum potential liability would be \$500,000 as a result in any given year.

Officials at the **City of West Plains** assume a negative fiscal impact on the city.

Officials at the **City of Centralia** assume a minor increase in workers compensation insurance of less than \$100 year.

Officials at the **St. Louis County** assume workers compensation rates will be impacted at less than \$1,000.

Officials at the **DeSoto Rural Fire Protection District** assume no savings to the District unless they elect to limit any life benefit currently received.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill establishes the Line of Duty Compensation Act which allows a claim to be filed with the Division of Workers' Compensation within the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations on behalf of a law enforcement officer, emergency medical technician, paramedic, or firefighter who was killed in the line of duty. The claim must be filed no later than one year from the date of the death by the spouse, dependent, or other specified person. The amount of compensation for the claim will be \$10,000, subject to appropriations, for deaths occurring on or after August 28, 2009.


The provisions of the bill will expire six years from the effective date.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
