FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the Office of the Governor, Department of Public Safety – Missouri State Highway Patrol, and the Springfield Police Department assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agencies.

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** assume the proposed legislation would have no fiscal impact on the courts.

Officials from the **Boone County Sheriff's Department** state they already have a similar policy, but their policy only requires that interviews of suspects in homicide cases be recorded. Adding the other charges to policy is minor. However, costs would be incurred as it relates to expenditures for additional storage mediums for recorded interviews. Officials state they would need to purchase additional disks/DVDs to store recordings of interviews. These costs are anticipated to be minor, probably not in excess of \$100 annually.

Oversight assumes local law enforcement agencies could absorb any minor costs incurred as a result of the proposal within existing resources.

Officials from the Office of the State Public Defender, Greene County Sheriff's Department, Jackson County Sheriff's Department, St. Louis County Police Department, Columbia Police Department, and the Kansas City Police Department did not respond to Oversight's request for fiscal impact.
