FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Natural Resources** assume this proposal would have minimal fiscal impact.

Section 60.670.2 of this proposal would require the Office of the Land Surveyor in the Department of Natural Resources to promulgate rules and regulations establishing minimum standards of GIS cadastral parcel mapping. Any map designed and used to reflect legal property descriptions or boundaries for use in a GIS system must comply with such rules.

Officials from the **State Tax Commission** and **Department of Revenue** assume there will be no fiscal impact to their agency.

Officials from **Pulaski County** assume this proposal would cost an additional \$16,000.

Oversight assumes this proposal as written is enabling legislation and would require action by the county's governing body or by citizen petition with voter approval before fiscal impact would be realized. **Oversight** assumes no state or local fiscal impact.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION


This act requires the Office of the Land Surveyor in the Department of Natural Resources to promulgate rules and regulations establishing minimum standards for GIS cadastral parcel mapping. Any map designed and used to reflect legal property descriptions or boundaries for use in a GIS system shall comply with such rules.

The practice of land surveying shall include working with positions of the United States Public Land Survey System and creating, preparing, or modifying computerized data, including land information systems and geographic information systems.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
