FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Office of the Secretary of State** (SOS) many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The Secretary of State's Office is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal not to Secretary of State's office for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The Secretary of State's Office recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that dditional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, we also recognize that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a give year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what their office can sustain with their core budget. Therefore, they reserve the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a reveiw of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

Officials from the **Department of Conservation** assume this proposal would permit hand fishing for catfish between June 1st and July 31st each year requiring new enforcement, fisheries management, and regulatory costs in an effort to ensure sustainable fish populations.

Oversight assumes that MDC could require a valid license for hand fishing; however, Oversight also assumes that only a minimal number of persons would choose this method of fishing. Therefore, Oversight has not included any fiscal impact to the Conservation Commission Fund.

Officials from the **Department of Natural Resources** assume there will be no fiscal impact to their agency.
