FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Department of Economic Development** assume that there is no fiscal impact from this proposal.

Officials at the **Department of Labor and Industrial Relations** (**DOLIR**) state that under current law, a claimant is eligible to receive a waiting week payment if the remaining monetary balance on his or her claim is equal to or less than his or her Weekly Benefit Amount. The waiting week payment is received at the end of the claim process as the claimant is exhausting his or her claim. Claimants who do not exhaust their monetary entitlement do not receive payment for the waiting week.

It is DOLIR understanding that the purpose of this proposed legislation is to waive the waiting week requirement for unemployed workers who work in or reside in counties affected by a winter storm in January 2009. This payout would be a one time event occurring in the 2009 federal and state fiscal years.

If passed, this legislation would require DOLIR to develop procedures for identifying and paying the waiting week to individuals who reside in a county affected by the winter storm in January of 2009. Secondly, the agency will have to verify the work location of individuals whom do not reside in an affected county, but state they work in a county affected by the winter storm in January 2009. Identifying and verifying the work location of individuals claiming they were affected by this storm will be a manual process and require a massive information gathering process.

As DOLIR's current legacy computer system is 40-plus years old and is not easily modified, the proposed legislation would require current DOLIR staff to manually enter the waiting week payment into the computer system. This manual process will take a significant amount of work.

It is assumed that the number of individuals that would be affected by this provision could be large; however DOLIR has no way of determining the actual number of individuals who would file for the waiting week payment. Based on an average weekly benefit amount of \$ 253.40, the unemployment benefits being paid from the Unemployment Compensation Trust Fund could be significant.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This act waives the waiting week that must be served before becoming eligible to receive unemployment insurance for unemployed workers who were employed in or a resident of the counties of Barry, Bollinger, Butler, Cape Girardeau, Carter, Douglas, Dunklin, Howell, Madison, Mississippi, New Madrid, Oregon, Ozark, Pemiscot, Reynolds, Ripley, Scott, Shannon, Stoddard, Stone, Taney, and Wayne that were adversely affected by the winter storm in January of 2009. Workers shall have been employed in or been a resident of one of the aforementioned counties between January 26, 2009 and April 1, 2009 to be eligible for the waiver. The section, if enacted, shall expire April 1, 2009.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
