FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Missouri State Tax Commission** assume the proposal will not fiscally impact their organization.

Officials from the **Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration** state having reviewed the proposed legislation and having sought the conclusion of the appropriate board(s), they are of the opinion that this proposal, in its present form, has no fiscal impact on their organization.

Oversight notes that this proposal would change the classification of boat docks for appraisal purposes and that boat docks are currently considered personal property for taxation purposes. Oversight assumes that local governments could change the classification of boat docks for property taxation purposes if this proposal is enacted. Oversight is unable to determine the impact, if any, to local governments that would result from this change.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION


This proposal would define boat docks as real property for appraisal purposes.
