## FISCAL ANALYSIS

### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** assume the proposed legislation would have no fiscal impact on the courts.

Officials from the **Department of Mental Health (DMH)** assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agency. DMH currently contracts with certain counties to provide confinement for persons detained as sexually violent predators. This proposal would clarify and codify these arrangements.

Officials from the **Boone County Sheriff's Department** assume the proposal would potentially generate revenues. Any contract negotiated with the Department of Mental Health would have to include compensation for the daily expenses associated with housing the person. Those expenses are approximately \$62.50 per day. Without knowing what a contract might state, or how many persons they would house as a result of such a contract, officials are not able to offer an estimate of the revenues that could be generated.

**Oversight** assumes no local fiscal impact, as Department of Mental Health currently contracts with certain counties to provide confinement for persons detained as sexually violent predators, and the proposal clarifies and codifies these arrangements.
