FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State** (SOS) stated that many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, we also recognize that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what our office can sustain with our core budget. Therefore, we reserve the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

Officials from the Missouri Senate, the Missouri House of Representatives, the Office of State Courts Administrator, the Office of the Governor, the Office of the State Auditor, the Office of the State Treasurer, the Department of Agriculture, the Office of Administration, Administrative Hearing Commission and Division of Personnel, the Department of Conservation, the Department of Corrections, the Department of Economic Development, the Department of Health and Senior Services, the Department of Higher Education, the Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions, and Professional Registration, the Department of Mental Health, the Department of Public Safety, Office of the Director, Capitol Police, Division of Alcohol and Tobacco Control, Office of the Adjutant General/Missouri National Guard, Missouri Veterans Commission, and State Emergency Management Agency, the Department of Revenue, the Department of Social Services, the State Tax Commission, the Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules, the Joint Committee on Public Retirement, the Missouri Ethics Commission, the Missouri Gaming Commission, the MODOT and Highway Patrol Employees' Retirement System, the Office of the State Public Defender, Linn State Technical College, the Metropolitan Community Colleges, Cass County, St. Louis County, the City of Centralia, and the City of Kansas City, assume this proposal would have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

Officials from the **City of West Plains** assume this proposal could have a positive fiscal impact to their organization by standardizing the collective bargaining treatment of public employees.

ASSUMPTION (continued)

Officials from the **Department of Labor and Industrial Relations** (DOLIR) assume this proposal would increase the number of petitions filed and hearings held. DOLIR anticipates an increase in travel costs and administrative expenses, such as envelopes and postage. It is not possible to determine the exact fiscal impact at this time due to the uncertainty of workload. DOLIR included a cost estimate to implement this proposal; the amount stated was unknown, less than \$100,000, and the number of additional employees was not indicated.

Oversight assumes the additional workload could be absorbed with existing resources. If unanticipated additional costs are incurred or multiple proposals are enacted which increase the DOLIR workload, resources could be requested through the budget process.
