FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Health and Human Services** state this proposal will have no fiscal impact on their agency.

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE)** state their agency will incur costs to develop a model policy; however, they do not anticipate these costs will be significant.

DESE assumes local school districts will likely incur costs to adopt policies on allergy prevention and response. DESE defers to local school districts regarding the level of expected costs.

Oversight assumes that since DESE will develop a model policy that school districts may use, school district cost should be minimal. **Oversight** will show no fiscal impact.

Officials from the following school districts assumed little or no fiscal impact: Blue Springs, Special School District of St Louis County, Francis Howell, and Sikeston.

This proposal was sent to the following districts who did not respond to a request for fiscal impact: Columbia, Independence, Jefferson City, Kansas City, Kirksville, Lees' Summit, Marshfield, Mehlville, Mexico, Nixa, Parkway, Silex, St Charles, St Joseph, St Louis, and Sullivan.
