ASSUMPTION

Officials from the Office of State Courts Administrator, Department of Revenue, and Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

Officials from the **Office of Secretary of State (SOS)** state the fiscal impact for this proposal is less than \$2,500. The SOS realizes this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs.
