ASSUMPTION

Officials from the Office of State Courts Administrator, the Missouri Highway Patrol, the City of Kansas City, and the City of Centralia assume this proposal would have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

Officials from the **Office of the Boone County Sheriff** assume this proposal would have a minimal one-time cost to their organization for training weekend warrant specialists to make such entries.

Officials from the **Office of the Attorney General** assume that any potential costs arising from this proposal could be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials from **Cass County** assumed a previous version of this proposal would have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Officials from the **St. Louis County Police Department** responded to our request for information on a previous version of this proposal but did not provide an estimate of the fiscal impact.

Oversight assumes this proposal would have no fiscal impact to the state and that any impact to local governments would be minimal and could be absorbed with existing resources. Oversight will indicate no fiscal impact for this fiscal note.
