#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

#### Section 195.017:

Officials from the Missouri State Highway Patrol, Department of Mental Health, Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions & Professional Registration and the Office of the State Courts Administrator each assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their respective agencies.

In response to a previous version of this proposal, officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services**, **Office of Prosecution Services** and the **Department of Public Safety** each assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Social Services** assumes there is no fiscal impact to the Department. This legislation merely adds certain drugs to the controlled substance list maintained by DHSS. It does not directly affect whether or not a drug would or would not be included on the Medicaid formulary.

In response to a previous version of this proposal, officials from the **Office of the Attorney General** assume any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** state many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with the core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

**Oversight** assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process. Any decisions to raise fees to defray costs would likely be made in subsequent fiscal years.

#### ASSUMPTION (continued)

In response to a previous version of this proposal, officials from the **Office of the State Public Defender (SPD)** state for purposes of the proposal, the SPD cannot assume existing staff will provide competent, effective representation for any new cases arising where indigent persons are charged with the proposed new crime of possession of 1-pentyl-3-(1-naphthoyl)indole a new schedule I controlled substance.

While the number of new cases may be too few or uncertain to request additional funding for this specific proposal, the SPD will continue to request sufficient appropriations to provide competent and effective representation in all of the SPD cases.

**Oversight** assumes the SPD could absorb the additional caseload that may result from this proposal within existing resources. Oversight assumes any significant increase in the workload of the SPD would be reflected in future budget request.
