#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Attorney General's Office** assume that any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials from the **Department of Transportation (MHTC)** assume this change will have a positive fiscal impact on their agency. Prior to the implementation of binding arbitration, MHTC's total tort costs captured amounted to approximately \$4 million. In 2009, MHTC's total tort costs captured amounted to approximately \$11.9 million, an increase of nearly \$8 million. MHTC assumes an annual savings of \$2,000,000 to the Road Fund as a result of this proposal.

This proposal repeals section 226.095 RSMo., which requires the Department of Transportation to participate in binding arbitration upon the request of a plaintiff in a tort case.

**Oversight** has shown the savings to the State Road Fund as unknown greater than \$100,000.

## FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

### FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This act repeals a provision of law which currently requires MoDOT to submit to binding arbitration upon the request of a plaintiff in a negligence action.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
