### FISCAL ANALYSIS

### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education** state that this bill stipulates that summer school Average Daily Attendance(ADA) is generated only by core courses. Core courses makeup 54.25% of the ADA for the summer school completed in 2010. By taking the total summer school ADA for 2010 (18246.1441) and multiply that by the average amount per WADA(\$3,628.74) the total is \$66,510,513. If the ADA for only the core courses is used, the total is \$3,628.74 X 9898.53=\$35,919,192. That is a difference of \$30,591,321.

It should be noted that summer school enrollment dropped drastically last year due to uncertainty about whether summer school would be funded. If the data for the 2009 summer school is used with the same methodology, then the amount of difference would be \$111,557,670 - 59,627,565= \$51,930,106. In both cases the amount used for only core courses creates a substantial savings to the state.

**Oversight** assumes the data provided for 2010 should be used for the calculation of savings related to summer school restrictions.

Officials from the **Parkway School District** assumed this proposal would result in reduction of state revenue in excess of \$100,000.

Officials from the **Special School District of St Louis County** assume this proposal would result in a loss to their district of about \$708,000 per based on summer school attendance from the last school year.

### FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

## FISCAL DESCRIPTION

### *§163.036*

Beginning with the 2011-2012 school year, summer school attendance to be included in average daily attendance will only count attendance hours based exclusively on academic areas of study. Curriculum must be based on core subject areas. Each school district must verify to the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education that the district's summer school program conforms to this requirement. School districts may provide a summer school program that offers non-academic or enrichment activities at the district's expense

### *§163.037*

This proposal repeals language that would trigger an increase in state funding if summer school attendance were to decrease by twenty-five percent as compared to the 2005-2006 school year summer school attendance.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
