FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of the Governor** assume there should be no added cost to the Governor's Office as a result of this proposed legislation.

Officials from the **Missouri Senate** state this proposal either has no fiscal impact as it relates to their agency or minimal costs which can be absorbed by present appropriations.

Officials from the **Missouri House of Representatives** indicated no fiscal impact resulting from this proposal.

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education** indicated there would be no additional cost to the state under the provisions of this proposed legislation. The revenue flow to the district would not be altered and modifying the governance structure would not increase the cost of the operation of the district. All actions taken by the State Board would be within the normal business operations of the State Board. The changes in governance structure would be covered by the budget of the impacted district.

Officials from the **Morgan County R-I School District (MC R-I)** assume the fiscal impact would be minimal because the process is already in place. MC R-I assumes this proposal would allow the state to intervene sooner rather than later. The proposal could cause some schools to be in the process a little quicker, which could cause some expense for those districts.

This proposal was also sent to the following Provisionally Accredited and Unaccredited school districts who did not respond to a request for fiscal impact: St Louis Public Schools, Riverview Gardens, Kansas City, Swedeberg, Jennings, Caruthersville, Normandy, Gilliam, Malta Bend.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

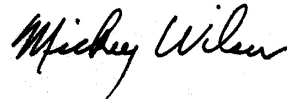
FISCAL DESCRIPTION
