FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration** assume there will be no fiscal impact to their agency.

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services** assume Section 334.155.4 states any rule revision and on-site review required at hospitals and/or ambulatory surgical centers to ensure compliance with the requirement for physician administration of injections would be minimal and would be accomplished by existing Division of Regulation and Licensure staff. There is assumed to be no fiscal impact to the agency.

The proposed language in Section 334.155.4 of the proposed legislation will require hospitals and ambulatory surgical centers to ensure that only physicians perform this procedure. To the extent that these facilities utilize other professionals for this procedure, they would be impacted by the need to reassign this procedure to physicians on their staff.


FISCAL DESCRIPTION
