#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules, Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol, Department of Labor and Industrial Relations and Department of Revenue each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

In response to a pervious version of this proposal, officials from the **Department of Transportation** assumed the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** assume many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the Secretary of State's Office for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, we also recognize that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what our office can sustain with our core budget. Therefore, we reserve the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.
