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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of Administration (COA)** state it is unknown how many state employees are members of the United States Coast Guard Auxiliary (USCGA), what their salaries are and how many occasions they would be called into service. In addition, the service could be 1-15 days per year, or unlimited time per year, depending on the basis of the mission. There would be a fiscal impact for state government, but it would be difficult to estimate what it would be with any accuracy.

As a practical concern, other employers may incur costs even if they are not providing paid leave for the absence. If an employee is absent for a period of 15 working days, there may be potential costs of overtime from others to cover for the absence, costs for temporary employees to cover the absence or a cost of lost productivity. This could have an impact on all businesses.

Officials from the **Attorney General's Office** assume that any potential costs of the proposal could be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials from the **Department of Labor and Industrial Relations** and the **Department of Public Safety** (**Missouri Highway Patrol**, **Alcohol and Tobacco Control**, **Capitol Police**, **Fire Safety**, and the **State Emergency Management Agency**) each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

According to the U.S. Department of Homeland Security - United States Coast Guard Auxiliary, the district which Missouri is a part (8th Western Rivers Coast Guard Auxiliary District) has 1,350 volunteer members. Missouri is one of sixteen states within this district. Therefore, **Oversight** assumes Missouri has approximately 85 (1,350 / 16) volunteer members. Oversight also assumes only a percentage of these are state workers.

Because of the assumed small number of USCGA members, **Oversight** assumes the proposal would not have a material direct fiscal impact to the state. Oversight assumes if a state worker / USCGA member is granted a leave of absence for up to 15 days (or longer for a declared emergency or disaster), this could create a temporary backlog of work to be covered by rescheduling of other employees.
