## FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol**, **Office of the State Courts Administrator** and **Department of Revenue** each assume the current proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Attorney General's Office** assume that any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials from the **Boone County Sheriff's Department** assume the current proposal would not fiscally impact their department.

Officials from the **City of Kansas City** assume the current proposal would not fiscally impact their agency.

In response to a similar proposal from last year, SB 277, officials from the **City of Raytown** assumed no fiscal impact to their city.

In response to a previous version of this legislation, officials from the **Department of Transportation** assumed the proposal would not fiscally impact their agency.

Officials from the City of Columbia, City of Gladstone, Independence Police Department and Kansas City Police Department did not respond to Oversight's request for fiscal impact.

**Oversight** assumes this proposal will require each municipality to require at least one street be available for use by commercial motor vehicles to access any roads in the state highway system and modifies the commercial zone surrounding Kansas City. Oversight also assumes this will not fiscally impact state or local governments.
