FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Department of Mental Health (DMH)** state this proposal would provide every person with a visual, aural, or other disability the same rights afforded to a person with no such disability to the full and free use of the streets, highways, sidewalks, walkways, public buildings, public facilities, and other public places as well as other accommodations.

DMH assumes the proposal addresses issues related to trainers of service dogs, search and rescue dogs, etc. – giving them the right to be accompanied by dogs that are being trained. It further defines certain categories of service dogs.

DMH assumes there is no fiscal impact from this proposed legislation.

Officials at the **Department of Social Services (DSS)** assume this proposal extends to people with mental disabilities the same rights that people with physical disabilities have with respect to service dogs.

DSS states the proposal extends to any adult "who has been trained to handle the service dog" the same rights as the disabled person.

DSS states the department already has a policy in place to accommodate employees and applicants for their disability or medical condition under (Administrative Policy 2-123) known as the Work Adjustment/Accommodation Request.

DSS states that is abides by all state and federal laws relating to employment practices and work accommodations (Administrative Policy 2-102 Equal Employment opportunity).

DSS assumes there is no fiscal impact from this proposed legislation.

Officials at the **Department of Labor and Industrial Relations**, **Office of Administration**, and **Department of Agriculture** each assume there is no fiscal impact from this proposed legislation.

Oversight assumes there is no fiscal impact from this proposed legislation on state or local government funds.
