FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Division of Fire Safety** state they currently administer the Fireworks Licensing and Enforcement program. This legislation clarifies language in regards to the classification of fireworks in order to be consistent with the U.S. Department of Transportation and the American Pyrotechnics Association. There is no cost associated with these changes.

Officials from the **Attorney General's Office** assume any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials from the **Office of Prosecution Services, Office of the State Public Defender, Department of Transportation, and the Office of the State Courts Administrator** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

In response to a previous version of the proposal, officials from the **Department of Corrections** assumed the proposal would not fiscally impact their agency.


FISCAL DESCRIPTION
