FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Department of Agriculture (AGR)** state the **State Milk Board (SMB)** is required to investigate any disease outbreaks resulting from raw milk sales.

AGR assumes it is difficult to predict the number or timing of potential disease outbreaks from raw milk sales. AGR assumes there would be an unknown fiscal impact to this proposal.

Oversight assumes investigating disease outbreaks from the sale of raw milk is part of the normal duties and responsibilities of the SMB. In the event a measurable increase in raw milk disease outbreaks occurs as a result of this proposal, and additional investigations are required by the SMB. AGR may request additional funding for the increase in investigations through the normal appropriation process.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** state many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with the core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

Oversight assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process.

Officials at the **Office of Attorney General (AGO)** assumes that any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials at the **Joint Committee on Administrative Rules** assume this proposal is not anticipated to cause a fiscal impact beyond its current appropriation.
