FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Missouri Ethics Commission (MEC)** assume the proposal would prohibit a member of the general assembly from becoming a lobbyist for a specified period of time. One Business Analyst would be needed to conduct the routine work necessary in reviewing and providing oversight for the proposal. The oversight would include reviewing the registrations, creating the correspondence, answering necessary correspondence and communication, and tracking the results. The Commission's current resources assists all lobbyists with the monthly filing and bi-annual filings, answers all lobbyists questions, sends out all lobbyists late and non filer notices, handles the lobbyist annual registrations, and provides the support for the Campaign Finance filers. This resource would be unable to provide any additional support for the increased work anticipated. Currently the Commission receives approximately 15,800 lobbyist reports annually.

Officials at the **Missouri House of Representatives, Missouri Senate** and the **Office of the Governor** assume there is no fiscal impact from this proposal.

Oversight assumes that the proposed changes in section 105.456 prohibits certain elected officials from registering as a lobbyist. It is unclear if the change would increase or decrease the number of individuals filing lobbyist reports. **Oversight** assumes the MEC should be able to absorb the cost of this proposal.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.


FISCAL DESCRIPTION
