#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Department of Insurance**, **Financial Institutions**, and **Professional Registration**, the **Department of Health and Senior Services** and the **Missouri House of Representatives** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

Officials from the **Missouri Senate (SEN)** state the proposal will either have no fiscal impact as it relates to the SEN or minimal costs that can be absorbed by present appropriations.

Officials from the **Department of Social Services - MO HealthNet Division (MHD)** state the legislation would require that hospitals track the re-hospitalizations (including causes and incidences) of premature infants (infants that are born earlier than 37 weeks gestation) during their first six months of life and report this information to the MHD. The MHD shall submit the reports to the Missouri Task Force on Prematurity and Infant Mortality. The MHD may incur minimal administrative expenses to obtain and submit the reports received from hospitals, but this could be accomplished with existing staff. Therefore, there would not be a fiscal impact to the MHD.

No hospitals responded to **Oversight's** request for a statement of fiscal impact.
