#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

In response to a previous version of this proposal, officials from the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** and the **Administrative Hearing Commission** each assumed the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Social Services (DOS)** state this bill allows an administrative hearing officer to correct an administrative decision or order that contains clerical mistakes arising from oversight or omission at any time prior to the court's review of the administrative decision. The change may be initiated by the hearing officer. In addition, any party to the action can file a written motion with the hearing officer requesting the change. A copy of the written motion must be made available to all parties. Any objection or response to the written motion must be made in writing and filed with the hearing officer within fifteen days (this was seven days in the original bill) from the mailing date of the motion.

The changes proposed in this bill will allow DOS to administratively address incorrect and invalid administrative hearing decisions, orders, and proposed orders to better serve the parties to an Family Support Division (FSD) child support case. However, FSD does not anticipate this bill having a significant fiscal impact to the FSD's child support program.
