FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

§§192.360 and 324.007 - Professional licensing

According to officials from the **Department of Insurance**, **Financial Institutions and Professional Registration (DIFP)**, the proposed legislation has an unknown cost to DIFP, contingent on board staff and board members' ability to convert education/training into compliance with licensure/examination requirements. Examination requirements for some boards are set by national testing companies.

Oversight assumes DIFP would be able to comply with the provisions of this proposal with existing resources. If additional resources are needed, DIFP can request them through the appropriations process.

§173.1158 - College credit for military courses

Officials from Linn State Technical College assume an unknown fiscal impact on their college.

Officials from the **University of Central Missouri** estimate fiscal impact of no more than \$45,000 annually, and that only in the event the number of students who are veterans are a significant number that would require an additional staff member (salary plus benefits) to examine course equivalencies.

Northwest Missouri State University officials assume there will be a fiscal impact; however, cannot quantify or project the impact without knowing the exact number of military members who will enroll as a result of this legislation.

Officials from **St. Charles Community College** anticipate an unknown cost to evaluate military records.

Officials from Missouri Southern University state an indeterminate fiscal impact at this time.

Oversight assumes, based on the responses from colleges and universities, that the cumulative fiscal impact of this proposal would be less than \$100,000 per year, beginning with the 2014-2015 academic year.

ASSUMPTION (continued)

According to officials from the **Office of Secretary of State (SOS)**, many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS's office is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to Secretary of State's office for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what their office can sustain with their core budget. Therefore, SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

Oversight assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal with core funding. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the

Officials from the Department of Higher Education, Department of Public Safety - Missouri National Guard and the Missouri Veterans Commission, Department of Health and Senior Services, Joint Committee on Administrative Rules, Kansas City Metropolitan Community College, University of Missouri System, and Missouri State University each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies and institutions.

§173.1158 - College credit for military courses

This section of the proposal requires higher education institutions to accept credits for courses that the military awarded to personnel as part of their military training if the courses meet certain standards for academic credit.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
