FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Corrections (DOC)** state this proposal creates the crime of failing to stop illegal firearm possession, negligent storage of a firearm and failure to notify a school of firearm ownership.

Penalty provisions, the component of the bill to have potential fiscal impact for DOC, is for up to a class D felony. Currently, the DOC cannot predict the number of new commitments which may result from the creation of the offense(s) outlined in this proposal. An increase in commitments depends on the utilization by prosecutors and the actual sentences imposed by the court.

If additional persons are sentenced to the custody of the DOC due to the provisions of this legislation, the DOC will incur a corresponding increase of direct offender costs either through incarceration (FY12 average of \$17.059 per offender, per day, or an annual cost of \$6,227 per inmate) or through supervision provided by the Board of Probation and Parole (FY12 average of \$4.960 per offender, per day, or an annual cost of \$1,810 per offender).

The following factors contribute to DOC's minimal assumption:

- DOC assumes the narrow scope of the crime will not encompass a large number of offenders;
- The low felony status of the crime enhances the possibility of plea-bargaining or imposition of a probation sentence; and
- The probability exists that offenders would be charged with a similar but more serious offense or that sentences may run concurrent to one another.

In summary, supervision by the DOC through probation or incarceration would result in some additional costs, but it is assumed the impact would be \$0 or a minimal amount that could be absorbed within existing resources.

For the purpose of this proposed legislation, officials at the **Office of State Public Defender (SPD)** cannot assume that existing staff will provide effective representation for any new cases arising where indigent persons are charged with the proposed new crime of failing to stop the illegal possession of a firearm - a new Class D felony. The bill also creates the crime of negligent storage of a firearm - also a Class D felony.

ASSUMPTION (continued)

While the number of new cases (or cases with increased penalties) may be too few or uncertain to request additional funding for this specific bill, the SPD will continue to request sufficient appropriations to provide effective representation in all cases.

Oversight assumes the SPD can absorb the additional caseload that may result from this proposal.

Officials from the **Office of Prosecution Services (OPS)** assume the proposal would not have a fiscal impact on their agency. The creation of a new crime creates additional responsibilities for county prosecutors which may, in turn, result in additional costs which are difficult to determine.

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol** and the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education** deferred to local school districts regarding costs associated with collecting, filing, and recording the firearm notifications as defined in Section 571.099.

Officials from the school districts of Columbia, Jefferson City, Sedalia, Lee's Summit, and St. Louis did not respond to our request for fiscal impact.

Oversight assumes school districts will be able to absorb the additional duties assigned to them within this bill without incurring additional expense. Oversight also assumes the potential additional fine revenue that may be collected as a result of this proposal will be minimal, and will not reflect it in the fiscal note.
