### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services**, **Department of Mental Health**, **Missouri Department of Conservation** and **Department of Social Services** each assume the current proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Missouri Highway Patrol** state that the Department of Transportation Employee Benefits Section will be responding on behalf of the Highway Patrol.

Officials from the **Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration** state that insurers would be required to submit amendments to their policies to comply with the legislation. Policy amendments must be submitted to the department for review along with a \$50 filing fee. The number of insurance companies writing these policies in Missouri fluctuates each year. One-time additional revenues to the Insurance Dedicated Fund are estimated to be up to \$5,700.

Additional staff and expenses are not being requested with this single proposal, but if multiple proposals pass during the legislative session which require policy form reviews the department will need to request additional staff to handle the increase in workload.

Officials from the **Department of Transportation** and **Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan** did not respond to Oversight's request for fiscal impact.

# FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

Small businesses engaged in the practice of medical insurance may be fiscally impacted by the new policy amendment requirements.

# FISCAL DESCRIPTION

Under this proposal, health carriers issuing or renewing health benefit plans on or after January 1, 2014, shall not deny coverage for a health care service on the basis that the service was provided through telemedicine if the same service would be covered when delivered in person.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
