FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** state many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with the core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

Oversight assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process.

Officials from the **Department of Corrections, Missouri Veterans Commission, Office of the State Courts Administrator, Department of Public Safety, Missouri Gaming Commission, Joint Committee on Public Retirement, Office of the State Auditor, Administrative Hearing Commission, Missouri Department of Conservation, Missouri Senate, Joint Committee on Administrative Rules, Missouri Ethics Commission, Office of the State Public Defender, Office of the State Treasurer, Department of Social Services, Missouri Lottery Commission, Office of the Governor, State Tax Commission, MoDOT and Patrol Employees Retirement System, Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, Department of Health and Senior Services, Department of Mental Health, Attorney General's Office, Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration, Missouri Highway Patrol, Department of Economic Development, Department of Agriculture, Department of Higher Education, Missouri House of Representatives and Office of Administration** each assume the current proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.
