FISCAL ANALYSIS

<u>ASSUMPTION</u>

Officials at **Johnson County** assume there would be approximately a \$6,240 fiscal impact from this proposal. This would be for the cost of premiums for their county surveyor who isn't currently covered by county health insurance.

Officials at **Carroll County** assume a cost of \$6,000 per year in the event a newly elected official would elect to take the coverage under this proposal. The County currently covers all elected officials with the exception of the County Surveyor on it's health care plan. The current Surveyor is not compensated by the County and chooses not to participate in the health care plan.

Officials at the **Department of Health and Senior Services** and the **Department of Insurance**, **Financial Institutions and Professional Registration** each assume no fiscal impact to their respective agencies from this proposal.

Officials at **Cole County** assume no fiscal impact from this proposal. They already provide insurance coverage only to elected officials compensated by the county.

In response to a previous version, officials at **Lincoln County** assume no fiscal impact from this proposal. They already provide full health insurance benefits for their elected officials.

Officials at **St. Louis County** and **St. Francois County** each assume no fiscal impact to their respective organizations from this proposal.

In response to a previous version, officials at Lawrence County and the St. Louis County Board of Election Commission each assume no fiscal impact to their respective organizations from this proposal.

Officials at the following counties: Andrew, Audrain, Barry, Bates, Boone, Buchanan, Callaway, Camden, Cape Girardeau, Cass, Clay, Cooper, Douglas, DeKalb, Franklin, Greene, Holt, Howell, Jackson, Jefferson, Johnson, Knox, Laclede, Marion, Miller, Moniteau, Monroe, Montgomery, New Madrid, Nodaway, Oregon, Ozark, Perry, Pettis, Phelps, Platte, Pulaski, Ripley, Scott, St. Charles, Taney, Texas, Warren, Wayne, Webster, Worth and Wright did not respond to **Oversight's** request for fiscal impact.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

Currently, a political subdivision may elect to contribute to a health insurance plan or similar benefit for its elected officials and employees as part of their compensation. When a county elects to furnish all or part of medical expenses then it must provide the benefit to all elected officials. This act modifies that language to provide that if a county elects to furnish all or part of the medical expenses, then it must do so only for those elected officials who are compensated by the county. The county may furnish medical expenses to other elected officials not compensated by the county.
