#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials at the **Office of Administration- Information Technology Services Division** assume there is no fiscal impact from this proposal.

Officials at the Department of Agriculture, the Department of Corrections, the Department of Economic Development, the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, the Department of Health and Senior Services, the Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration, the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, the Department of Mental Health, the Department of Natural Resources, the Department of Public Safety, the Department of Revenue and the Department of Social Services each defer to the Office of Administration - Information Technology Services Division for fiscal impact.

Officials at the **Missouri Veterans Commission** assume a minimal to no fiscal impact.

Officials at the **Office of Attorney General** assume that any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials at the **Office of State Courts Administrator** assume there may be some, unquantifiable at this time, impact. Any significant changes will be reflected in future budget requests.

Officials at the **Department of Conservation** assume a minimal negative impact.

Officials at the Department of Higher Education, the Department of Public Safety's Capitol Police, the Department of Public Safety's Division of Fire Safety, the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules, the Missouri Highway Patrol, the Missouri Gaming Commission, the Office of the State Auditor, the Office of Prosecution Services, the Office of the State Public Defender, the Office of State Treasurer, the State Emergency Management Agency and the State Tax Commission each assume there is no fiscal impact to their agency from this proposal.

In response to a previous version of this proposal, officials at the **Missouri Department of Transportation** assumed there was no fiscal impact from this proposal.

#### ASSUMPTION (continued)

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** state many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with the core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

**Oversight** assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process.

**Oversight** assumes that the agencies could absorb any costs associated with posting the required information on their agency website.
