#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS)** state for FY15, section 660.424 will require the Division of Senior and Disability Services (DSDS) to devote staff time to the evaluation of the program rate structure in conjunction with the adult day care programs. DSDS assumes it can absorb this cost.

Officials from the **Department of Social Services (DSS) - MO HealthNet Division (MHD)** assume rate setting will be done by the Department of Health and Senior Services. It is assumed there will be no fiscal impact to the MHD if a uniform rate applies to all Adult Day Care providers. In addition, no system changes will be needed.

Officials from the Office of Administration (OA) - Information Technology Services Division (ITSD) defer to the Department of Social Services regarding the fiscal impact of potential system changes.

Officials from the **OA** - **Administrative Hearing Commission** anticipate this legislation will not significantly alter its caseload. However, if similar bills pass resulting in more cases, there could be a fiscal impact.

For the purpose of this proposed legislation, officials at the **Office of State Public Defender** (**SPD**) cannot assume that existing staff will provide effective representation for any indigent clients faces with the enhanced penalties for failing to follow the guidelines regarding adult day cares escalated to a new class D felony.

While the number of new cases (or cases with increased penalties) may be too few or uncertain to request additional funding for this specific bill, the SPD will continue to request sufficient appropriations to provide effective representation in all cases.

**Oversight** assumes the SPD can absorb the additional caseload that may result from this proposal.

Officials from the **Department of Corrections (DOC)** state the penalty provisions for violations, the component of the bill to have a potential fiscal impact for DOC, is for up to a class D felony. Currently, the DOC cannot predict the number of new commitments which may result from the creation of the offense(s) outlined in this proposal. An increase in commitments depends on utilization by prosecutors and the actual sentences imposed by the court.

The DOC assumes supervision by the DOC through probation would result in some additional costs, but it is assumed the impact would be \$0 or a minimal amount that could be absorbed within existing resources.

# ASSUMPTION (continued)

Officials from the **Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR)** state the legislation is not anticipated to cause a fiscal impact to JCAR beyond its current appropriation.

Officials from the **Department of Mental Health**, the **Department of Public Safety - Division of Fire Safety**, and the **Office of Prosecution Services** assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their agency.

In response to the previous version of this proposal, officials from the **OA** - **Division of Purchasing and Materials Management** assumed the proposal would not fiscally impact their agency.

In response to the previous version of this proposal, officials from the **Office of Secretary of State (SOS)** stated many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The Secretary of State's office is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The SOS recognizes this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, it is also recognized that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain within its core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.
