ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Office of the Attorney General** assume that any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials at the **Office of the State Courts Administrator (CTS)** assume the fiscal impact of this proposal would not be in excess of \$100,000.

Oversight assumes that any costs from CTS relating to this proposal could be absorbed within their current appropriation level.

Officials at the **Office of the State Public Defender**, the **Department of Natural Resources** and the **Office of Prosecution Services** each assume no fiscal impact to their respective agencies from this proposal.

In response to a previous version, officials at **St. Louis County**, the **City of Columbia**, the **City of Kansas City**, the **City of Jefferson** and **Cole County** each assumed no fiscal impact to their respective organizations from this proposal.

Officials at the following cities: Clayton, Fulton, Harrisonville, Independence, Liberty, Springfield, St. Charles, St. Joseph and St. Louis did not respond to **Oversight's** request for fiscal impact.

Officials at the following counties: Boone, Buchanan, Callaway, Camden, Cape Girardeau, Cass, Clay, Franklin, Greene, Jackson, Jefferson, Platte, St. Charles, St. Francois, and Taney did not respond to **Oversight's** request for fiscal impact.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.


FISCAL DESCRIPTION
