## **FISCAL ANALYSIS**

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Office of Administration - Division of Budget and Planning (BAP)** assume this proposal would not result in any additional costs or savings to their organization.

Officials from the **Department of Labor and Industrial Relations** assume this proposal would have no fiscal impact on their organization. In response to similar provisions in HB 1234, LR 4565-01, DOLIR officials stated their organization does not consider volunteers to be employees; since volunteers are not considered employees, DOLIR officials would not consider them eligible for workers' compensation coverage under current provisions.

**Oversight** notes this proposal would make persons who agree in writing to work as volunteers exempt from workers' compensation coverage by statute, and assumes that would have no fiscal impact for the state or for local governments.

Officials from the Office of Administration - Office of the Director, St. Louis County, the City of Columbia, the City of Kansas City, the Francis Howell School District, and the St. Louis County Directors of Elections assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their organizations.
