FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Department of Corrections** (**DOC**) assume the penalty provision component of this bill resulting in potential fiscal impact for DOC, is for a class B felony. Currently, the DOC cannot predict the number of new commitments which may result from the creation of the offense(s) outlined in this proposal. An increase in commitments depends on the utilization by prosecutors and the actual sentences imposed by the court.

If additional persons are sentenced to the custody of the DOC due to the provisions of this legislation, the DOC will incur a corresponding increase in direct offender cost either through incarceration (FY13 average of \$18.014 per offender, per day, or an annual cost of \$6,575 per inmate) or through supervision provided by the Board of Probation and Parole (FY13 average of \$5.07 per offender, per day or an annual cost of \$1,851 per offender.)

In summary, supervision by the DOC through probation or incarceration would result in additional unknown costs to the department. Sixteen (16) persons would have to be incarcerated per each fiscal year to exceed \$100,000 annually. Due to the narrow scope of this new crime, it is assumed the impact would be less than \$100,000 per year for the DOC.

For the purpose of this proposed legislation, officials at the **Office of State Public Defender** (**SPD**) cannot assume that existing staff will provide competent, effective representation for any indigent clients faced with the enhanced penalties for class one election offenses - including illegally registering and many others.

While the number of new cases may be too few or uncertain to request additional funding for this specific bill, the SPD will continue to request sufficient appropriations to provide competent and effective representation in all cases where the right to counsel attaches.

Oversight assumes the SPD can absorb the additional caseload that may result from this proposal.

Officials at the **Office of Attorney General** assume that any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials at the **Office of Prosecution Services** and the **Office of the Secretary of State** each assume there is no fiscal impact to their respective organizations from this proposal.

Officials at the Office of State Courts Administrator anticipate an impact less than \$100,000.

Oversight assumes that the **Office of State Courts Administrator** can absorb these cases with existing resources.

Officials at the Kansas City Board of Election Commission, Lincoln County, Platte County Board of Election Commission and the St. Louis County Board of Election Commission each assume there is no fiscal impact to their respective organizations from this proposal.

Officials at the following boards of election commissions: St. Louis City Board of Election Commission, Clay County Board of Election Commission and the Jackson County Board of Election Commission did not respond to **Oversight's** request for fiscal impact.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

Under current law the crime of registering to vote knowing that one is not legally entitled to register or registering in the name of another carries a fine of between \$2,500 and \$10,000 and a term of imprisonment of not more than 5 years. This act imposes a term of up to 15 years with no monetary penalty, which is a Class B felony.

Under current law, class one election offenses carry a prison term of not more than 5 years. This act increases the term to 7 years.

Class one election offense offenders shall not be granted a suspended imposition of sentence; be eligible for probation or parole until serving a minimum of 30 days in prison; or act as an election judge, a challenger or a watcher.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
