### **FISCAL ANALYSIS**

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Department of Revenue** and the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Officials from the **Office of the State Courts Administrator (CTS)** assume the proposed legislation exempts violations of traffic laws enforced by automated traffic enforcement systems from the mandatory drivers' license point system. The CTS assumes there may be some, unquantifiable at this time, impact, but there is no way to quantify that currently. Any significant changes will be reflected in future budget requests.

**Oversight** notes that in November 2013, the Missouri Court of Appeals Eastern District ruled that the City of Ellisville's ordinance allowing automated traffic enforcement systems was deemed "void and unenforceable" because it conflicts with state law. Various other Missouri municipalities have since either received a similar judgement or voluntarily stopped collecting fines from red light traffic cameras.

**Oversight** is unsure how many local political subdivisions are currently assessing fines from automated traffic enforcement systems. Oversight assumes this proposal may result in a reduction in revenue to local political subdivisions if they are currently assessing fines more than the amount allowed in this proposal, and must reduce the fine to a maximum of \$135. Oversight will range the impact to local political subdivisions from \$0 (cities no longer allowed to assess fines for automated traffic enforcement systems because of recent court rulings and therefore this legislation would not have an impact) to an (Unknown) loss of fine revenue from the new limit for each fine (\$135).
