FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration** assume the adoption of this proposal may result in an unknown reduction of fee revenue from cosmetology licenses and renewals.

Officials from the **Missouri Department of Conservation, the Department of Natural Resources, the Department of Social Services, the Department of Mental Health and the Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol** each assume the current proposal will not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

In response to a previous version, officials from the **Department of Transportation** and the **Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan** each assumed the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the Department of Health and Senior Services and Office of the Secretary of State did not respond to Oversight's request for fiscal impact.

The proposed legislation appears to have no direct fiscal impact.


This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
