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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

<u>§167.923</u>

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE)** state that, based on job openings across the country, a dyslexia specialist makes anywhere from \$25-45 per hour, so salary would be \$52,000 - \$93,600, plus benefits.

According to DESE, Dyslexia is identified in the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) regulations as a type of learning disability. DESE does not track dyslexia; but does track learning disabilities. There will be a cost (likely under \$10,000) to enhance the DESE data system to capture dyslexia separately.

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services** state this proposal has no fiscal impact on their agency.

Officials from the **Special School District of St. Louis County** state no fiscal impact is expected from this proposed legislation.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

By January 1, 2015, the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) must employ a dyslexia specialist with a minimum of three years of field experience in screening, identifying, and treating dyslexia and related disorders in school districts. The dyslexia specialist will be responsible for the providing of professional development and serve as the primary source of information and support for school districts addressing the needs of students with dyslexia and related disorders.

By the 2015-2016 school year, DESE must develop and maintain a dyslexia resource guide for school districts, public schools, and teachers.
