FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Corrections (DOC)** state this legislation will have significant fiscal impact on the Department. By FY17, this proposal will cost the Department over \$10 million.

DOC states there are 5,691.91 FTE corrections custody officers in their FY 2014 budget.

FY 2015 impact: $5,691.91 \times $75 \text{ per month } x \text{ 6 months} = $2,561,360$

FY 2016 impact 5,691.91 x \$75 per month x 6 months

plus $5,691.91 \times $150 \text{ per month } \times 6 \text{ months} = $7,684,079$

FY 2017 impact $5,691.91 \times $150 \text{ per month } \times 12 \text{ months} = $10,245,438$

Each additional year's costs would be \$10,245,438 if the FTE number remains constant.

In summary, DOC assumes the proposal would be a cost to the General Revenue Fund of \$2,561,360 to Unknown in FY 2015, \$7,684,079 to Unknown in FY 2016, and \$10,245,438 to Unknown in FY 2017

Officials from the **Office of Administration - Personnel Division** state they are responsible for implementing a classification and pay system uniformly applied to each agency covered under the UCP system. Section 217.112 in SB 826 provides that all employees in classes listed in Section 217.112.3 shall receive a \$175/monthly pay differential.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This proposal provides that, beginning January 1, 2015, corrections officers must receive, in addition to their regular pay, \$75 per month for hazardous duty pay.

Beginning January 1, 2016, corrections officers must receive, in addition to their regular pay, \$150 per month for hazardous duty pay.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
