#### **FISCAL ANALYSIS**

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the Office of the Governor, the Office of Administration - Facilities

Management, Design and Construction, the Department of Economic Development - Office
of the Public Counsel, the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, the
Department of Corrections and the Department of Public Safety - Missouri National Guard
each assume the current proposal will not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Attorney General's Office** assume that any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials from the **Department of Mental Health** state that it does not appear that this proposal would create a fiscal impact to their department, but defers to the Office of Administration - Facilities Management, Design and Construction for actual costs or savings calculations.

In response to a previous version of this proposal, officials at the **Missouri Highway Patrol's Fleet and Facilities Division** assumed that this would include the entire property known as
Missouri State Highway Patrol Troop H in Buchanan County. This proposal only gives the
authority to sell the property. If the property were to sell at some future date, the Patrol assumes
the replacement would be handled through separate capital improvement legislation. The Patrol
does not have an estimate on the cost of rebuilding. The Patrol assumes that since this would be
a Troop location that is affected, Highway funds would be utilized.

**Oversight** assumes that the fiscal impact for this proposal would net to zero because of the potential reduction of state property from the conveyance/sale/transfer versus the potential proceeds from the conveyance/sale/transfer. Oversight will not reflect a direct net fiscal impact from this proposal.

Officials from the **Department of Economic Development - Division of Workforce Development** assume this proposal will result in a cost savings by consolidating the workforce program delivery into other existing facilities.

**Oversight** assumes the above result to Department of Economic Development - Division of Workforce Development is an indirect fiscal impact to their agency and will not show it in the fiscal note.
