FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

§ 340.396 - Veterinary Student Loan Program:

Officials from the **Department of Agriculture** assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their agency.

Officials from the **University of Missouri**, and the **State Treasurer's Office** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Oversight assumes the Veterinary Student Loan Payment Fund (0803) receives transfer payments from the Lottery Proceeds Fund (0291) as appropriated each fiscal year. In FY13 the Veterinary Student Loan Payment Fund had actual expenditures of \$120,000.

Oversight notes upon graduation, participants in the program are forgiven \$20,000 for each year of service in a designated area of need.

Oversight assumes this proposal would repeal the expiration date of the Large Animal Veterinarian Student Loan Program of June 30, 2013. Therefore, Oversight will show a cost of \$120,000 each fiscal year to the Lottery Proceeds Fund transferred to the Veterinary Student Loan Payment Fund for the continuation of this program.

Officials from the **Department of Higher Education** did not respond to **Oversight's** request for fiscal impact.

This proposal removes the expiration date of the Large Animal Veterinarian Student Loan Program.


This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
