FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** assume many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the Secretary of State's Office for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, we also recognize that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what our office can sustain with our core budget. Therefore, we reserve the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

Officials from the **Office of the Attorney General** assume that any potential costs arising from this proposal could be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials from the **Office of Administration - Division of General Services** assume the provision removing the prohibition on subrogation rights for employers could result in potential savings to the state's workers' compensation program.

Officials from the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules, the Department of Conservation, the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, the Department of Transportation, Linn State Technical College, Missouri State University, Missouri Western State University, the University of Central Missouri, the University of Missouri, St. Louis County, the City of Kansas City, the Board of Police Commissioners of Kansas City, Missouri, and the St. Louis County Directors of Elections assume this proposal would have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

Oversight assumes the provisions in this proposal have the potential to reduce employer costs in workers' compensation cases and will indicate a savings of \$0 to Unknown to the General Revenue Fund and to local governments.
