Bill Summary: This proposal allows a retired military member to provide a Veteran's Identification Card issued by the United States Department of Veteran Affairs in order to receive a veteran designation on his or her driver's license.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Joint Committee on Administrative Rules** state this legislation is not anticipated to cause a fiscal impact beyond its current appropriation.

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Veterans Commission** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** assume many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the Secretary of State's Office for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, we also recognize that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what our office can sustain with our core budget. Therefore, we reserve the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

Oversight assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process.

Officials from the **Department of Revenue (DOR)** assume this proposal adds "A United States Uniformed Services Identification Card", otherwise known as a DD Form 2, that includes a discharge status of "retired" or "reserve retired" establishing the person's service in the Armed Forces of the United States", as an eligible document to provide for purposes of requesting a veteran designation.

Administrative Impact

The following procedures will need to be implemented for the changes in this proposal:

- Drafting updates to website information and other communications related to the veteran designation;
- Updating office procedures;

ASSUMPTION (continued)

- Analysis and development of Missouri Electronic Driver License (MEDL) system change requirements document to define MEDL messaging changes required for acceptance of the United States Uniformed Services Identification Card; and
- Completion of end-user testing by our internal staff. This will require overtime from existing staff in order to perform the testing.

In summary, DOR assumes a cost of \$22,264 (\$13,574 + \$8,790) in FY 2016 to provide for the implementation of the changes in this proposal.

Oversight assumes DOR is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of activity each year. Oversight assumes DOR could absorb the costs related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require additional staffing and duties at substantial costs, DOR could request funding through the appropriation process.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.


FISCAL DESCRIPTION
