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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Mental Health (DMH)** state the Division of Developmental Disabilities (DD) occasionally places consumers with an out-of-state home- and community-based provider when the provider's skills or ability is best matched to serve a consumer's unique set of needs and no in-state placement option is available. The proposed legislation would cause any consumer in such a placement who receives Missouri Medicaid benefits to lose them, potentially increasing costs to DD. Because placements such as these are very infrequent, the DMH assumes it should be able to absorb any future costs that might accrue due to the provisions of this proposal.

Officials from the **Department of Social Services (DSS) - MO HealthNet Division (MHD), Family Support Division (FSD),** and **Division of Legal Services**, assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their organization.

DSS does not anticipate any savings as a result of this proposal because it is DSS' current policy to terminate the benefits of recipients found to no longer be Missouri residents. Whenever MHD receives information that indicates a recipient may no longer be a Missouri resident, FSD is notified. FSD then redetermines the recipient's eligibility. It is possible, however, for recipients to receive services from out-of-state providers in certain circumstances, i.e. when traveling or when a recipient's needs can not be met by an in-state provider.

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services** assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their agency.
