FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

§§ 33.150, 33.710, 43.518, 160.530, 191.828, 217.550, 217.567, 320.092, 348.439, 361.120, and 630.010 - Existing, Expired, or Obsolete Committees:

In response to the previous version of this proposal, officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** stated many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with the core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

Oversight assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process.

Officials from the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, Department of Revenue, Department of Social Services, Office of Administration, Office of the Attorney General, Office of the State Auditor, Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, Legislative Research, and the State Treasurer's Office each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

In response to the previous version of this proposal, officials from the Department of Mental Health, Department of Higher Education, Department of Natural Resources, Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration, Department of Public Safety, Department of Transportation, Department of Health and Senior Services, Missouri House of Representatives, Missouri Ethics Commission, Office of Governor, and the University of Missouri each assumed the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.
