**Bill Summary:** This proposal changes intersectional references relating to court costs.

## Fiscal Analysis

Officials at the **City of O'Fallon** assume if the court automation fee were to stay within each City and not go to the State, then the \$7.00 fee could produce \$84,000. If the cities were to receive a portion of the \$7.00, say \$3-\$5, then O'Fallon would recover an estimated \$36,000 - \$60,000.

**Oversight** assumes this legislation is making corrections to some intersectional references relating to court costs and there would be no fiscal impact from this proposal.

Officials at the Office of the State Public Defender, the Office of the State Courts Administrator, the Office of the State Treasurer, Office of Prosecution Services and the Department of Revenue each assume no fiscal impact from this proposal.

Officials at the Platte County Board of Election Commission, the City of Columbia, the St. Louis County Board of Election Commission, the City of Jefferson and St. Louis County each assume no fiscal impact from this proposal.
